One: Jesus says, "I am the Truth for you."


All: And so we come to dwell in the light.

All: By worshipping God, by loving others, and by respecting what God has created.

One: What did God create?

All: God created all that is, seen and unseen.

One: What is special about human beings?

All: God made us, all people, in the image of God.

One: What does it mean that we are made in God's image?

All: It means we are made to reflect God's goodness, wisdom and love.

One: The Lord be with you.


All: And also with you.

We trust in your tender compassion.


You are the good Samaritan, we the wounded traveler.

You ate with Mary, Martha, and Zacchaeus,


and you filled Emmaus with your resurrection.
